* The Nursery and Pre-School receives Partnership Funding from Glasgow City Council for the provision of 1,140 hours of childcare per year. All eligible families will receive this funding and no fees will be payable. Wraparound care is available from 3pm - 6pm (term time) and is chargeable at £19 per day if hours exceed the funded hours. Early morning provision is also available between 8.00am - 8.30am and this is chargeable at £6.00 per day. Provision is also available during the holiday periods (excluding 2 weeks at Christmas) and is chargeable at £40 per day if hours exceed funded hours. All Nursery and Pre-School charges will be billed one month in arrears.

** A £249 pupil device levy will be added to the above fees for P6, S1 and S3

All fees above are excluding VAT. VAT will be applied to school fees (P1 - S6) from 1st January 2025.

Sibling discounts are available as follows:

Eldest of 4 50% discount Eldest of 3 25% discount

We must highlight that in calculating eligibility for sibling discounts, only full feepaying pupils are taken into account, e.g. for a family of 3 where one child is in the preschool/nursery and receiving funding, then the eldest of 3 would not be eligible for a discount.

Please note that eligible families can only receive one form of discount or financial support, e.g. if a family is in receipt of a bursary, they cannot also receive a sibling discount.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

From its inception in 1641 by the two brothers Hutcheson our charitable purpose has been clear, and our mission is to target our support to those who need it most. We offer financial assistance in two ways:

Transformational bursaries - where 100% of the fees are paid for.

Fees assistance bursaries – where a fraction of the fees are paid for by the family, with the remainder, up to 100%, paid for by the school.

In a typical year, we are enormously proud that around 125 youngsters are in receipt of bursary support. This is about one pupil in seven in the senior school. It should be noted that despite our extensive fundraising we have a limited bursary pot. For entry into S1, we warmly welcome bursary applications from those who are truly in need. Regretfully, we are not able to offer bursary support to those joining us in later years, or in Primary. Those who perform better in our S1 entrance test will be prioritised alongside their financial need as we decide who receives a bursary offer, and whether it is transformational or to the level of fee assistance.

Following a bursary application, a careful and thorough set of checks is made on detailed evidence supplied by the family. This ranges from family income, where parents whose joint income is more than £65,000 are unlikely to be successful, to assets held such as property, businesses, size, and ownership of family home, etc.
